We are very excited to be serving as your MD33 84th Annual State Convention Committee. This year the convention will be held at the Sturbridge Host Hotel on May 4, 5 and 6. We have been working tirelessly to ensure that this convention is everything that you hope it will be. Our guest for the weekend will be 1st Vice President Wayne Madden and his wife Lion Linda from MD25 Lions - Auburn Lions Club.

Adding to the excitement of our International visitor, this year MD33 will have the opportunity to nominate a candidate for International Director. As you are aware, this is an opportunity that does not come up annually. We are fortunate to have this opportunity and look forward to increased attendance at this years convention as a result of this nomination.

As usual, our convention will open with a business meeting on Friday afternoon at 3pm. Friday night we will celebrate our Membership Key and Life members. Lions will have the opportunity to enjoy a flag ceremony, the Lions All State Band and a great meal. 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### Important notices - Deadline for registering: April 10, 2012

**Every** attendee must have a MD33 State Convention Registration. This includes (a) sales table staffing, (b) all delegates and (c) anyone staffing hospitality rooms. Because of the International Director election on Sunday we strongly recommend pre-registration to avoid delays. Registration times are firm and closing time will not be adjusted. We need to have registrations closed to allow host club members, committee members and CSTs to attend meetings.

**Registration times:** Registration tables will be open at the following times during the State Convention: Friday 2pm to 5pm, Saturday 8am to 11am and 2pm to 4pm, Sunday 8am to 9:30am. All delegates must first pick up their Convention registration **BEFORE** obtaining delegate cards from CSTs. The times for picking up delegate cards are the same as registration times. **Please note:** Registering as a delegate with your District CST *does not* automatically register you for the convention. All convention registrations are handled through the State Convention Committee.

Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.
